Hot food will be available from 4.30pm mainly a hog roast but there will be a vegetarian alternative & child friendly food e.g. sausages. Tickets will be £5 for a hog roast bun & a piece of tray bake (we will need to sell tickets to know how many to cater for) Tea coffee soft drinks, alcoholic drinks & snacks will be on sale throughout the event.
